

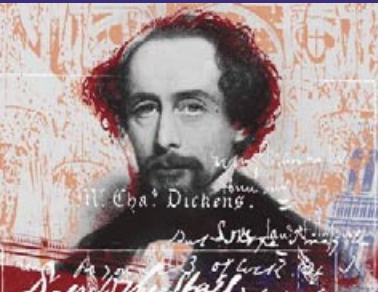

## Literary Landscapes of the 19th Century - SPRING 2012



### **EN 399/FR 399**

Explore the relationship between the **literature** and **visual arts** during the cultural and social movements in **France** and **England** during the **19<sup>th</sup> century**. Then, **travel** to England and France to visit some of the sites that inspired and informed the texts and paintings studied during the spring semester. The abroad portion will take place in May 2012.

### **Course requirements:**

Students must participate in excursions, class discussions, journaling, assigned readings, and group projects during the spring semester pre-departure course and while abroad. The course carries three (3) credit hours. Both the classroom and the travel portions of the course must be completed to earn the credit. No partial credit will be assigned. In addition to once per week class meetings during the spring semester, two pre-departure orientations are required of all participants.

**Pre-requisite:** any EN 200-level or above course or instructor approval.

**Participants may receive either EN or FR credit.**

## England & France: Literary Landscapes of the 19th Century

### *Tentative Itinerary:*

Day 1 >> Wed. May 9: (Departure airport to be announced)

- \* Depart the US on your overnight flight to Paris (airfare is additional to the program costs)

Day 2 >> Thurs. May 10: (Paris)

- \* Arrive at Charles de Gaulle Airport
- \* Meet your CEPA on-site coordinator
- \* Transfer by private bus from the airport to the hotel
- \* 3 nights in twin bedded rooms with private bathrooms incl. breakfast at a 3 star hotel in Paris
- \* Public transportation pass for the entire stay in Paris
- \* Guided boat tour on the **Bateaux Mouches**
- \* Ascend to the top of the Eiffel Tower
- \* Welcome Dinner at a restaurant in Paris

Day 3 >> Fri. May 11: (Paris)

- \* Guided walking tour of the **Right Bank and Île de la Cité** including Notre Dame, the Jardin des Tuileries, Place de la Concorde, and the Champs-Élysées
- \* Free time to explore the city...

Day 4 >> Sat. May 12: (Paris)

- \* Guided tour through the **Musée d'Orsay**
- \* Visit of the **Rodin Museum**
- \* Enjoy a Scavenger Hunt in the afternoon/evening

Day 5 >> Sun. May 13: (Paris - Giverny - Rouen)

- \* Transfer by private bus during the day
- \* Stop at **Monet's House and Gardens** in Giverny
- \* Guided walking tour of **Rouen**
- \* 2 nights in twin bedded rooms with private bathrooms incl. breakfast at a 2 to 3 star hotel in Rouen

Day 6 >> Mon. May 14: (Rouen - Honfleur)

- \* Free morning in Rouen...
- \* Travel by private bus to Honfleur
- \* Visit the **Eugène Boudin Museum**

Day 7 >> Tues. May 15 (Rouen - Paris)

- \* Travel by private bus to Paris
- \* 1 night in twin bedded rooms with private bathrooms incl. breakfast at a 3 star hotel in Paris
- \* Travel to the Montmartre Quarter
- \* Free time in the afternoon...
- \* Group dinner at a restaurant in Paris

Day 8 >> Wed. May 16: (Paris - London)

- \* Transfer by private bus to the train station and get on your Eurostar train to London
- \* 3 nights in twin bedded rooms with private bathrooms incl. breakfast at a 3 star hotel in London
- \* Guided walking tour of **Westminster and Whitehall**
- \* Visit the **Sherlock Holmes Museum**
- \* Group dinner at a restaurant in London

Day 9 >> Thurs. May 17: (London)

- \* Visit **Westminster Abbey**
- \* Visit the **Charles Dickens Museum**
- \* Visit the **Tate Britain** (collection of British art)

Day 10 >> Fri. May 18: (Oxford)

- \* Travel by train to Oxford
- \* Guided walking tour of **Oxford** (incl. entrance to the Christ Church College)
- \* Free time in the afternoon...

Day 11 >> Sat. May 19: (London - Haworth - Lake District)

- \* Travel by private bus during the day
- \* Stop in Haworth, which is home of the **Bronte Parsonage**
- \* 2 nights in twin bedded rooms with private bathrooms incl. breakfast at a 2 to 3 star hotel in Lake District

Day 12 >> Sun. May 20: (Lake District)

- \* Depart for Wordsworth's properties and Grasmere on foot

Day 13 >> Mon. May 21: (Lake District - Bath)

- \* Travel by private bus during the day
- \* 2 nights in twin bedded rooms with private bathrooms incl. breakfast at a 2 to 3 star hotel in Bath
- \* Scavenger Hunt of Bath in the afternoon
- \* Group dinner at a restaurant in Bath

Day 13 >> Tues. May 22: (Bath)

- \* Visit the World Heritage Site "Roman Baths"
- \* Visit the Jane Austen Centre
- \* Visit the Assembly Rooms

Day 14 >> Wed. May 23: (Bath - Chawton - London)

- \* Travel by private bus during the day
- \* Stop at **Jane Austen's House Museum** at Chawton
- \* 1 night in twin bedded rooms with private bathrooms incl. breakfast at a 3 star hotel in London
- \* Free time in the afternoon...

Day 14 >> Wed. May 23: (Bath - Chawton - London)

- \* Transfer by private bus to the airport London Heathrow or Gatwick
- \* Return flight to the USA (airfare is additional to the program costs)
