FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

We've teamed to up to bring ongoing vaccination clinics to the region, and are continually working to ensure more happen as vaccine dosages become available. Brought together by a shared commitment to the health and safety of all in our communities, we want to reach everyone in the region to help put a stop to this pandemic.

Here are some of the most common questions regarding vaccination clinics in our health district.

How can I pre-register for a future vaccination event?



While you cannot make an appointment for a specific date and time, you can pre-register for your vaccine in order to get on the list. To do so, individuals should visit:

www.vaccinate.virginia.gov.

Online registration is highly recommended.

This portal **DOES NOT** reserve a vaccine or create an appointment but it does collect contact information, so that when vaccine is available, the Virginia Department of Health can contact you to make an appointment.

What if I don't have online access? Is there a number I can call to pre-register for a future vaccination event?

Virginia residents can call **877-VAX-IN-VA** (877-829-4682).



Virginia Department of Health will continue working its way down the list for those eligible persons who have called or pre-registered online.

Are there extra doses available at these events for walk-ins?

No. Unless you are pre-registered or have been contacted by the Virginia Department of Health, please do not come to the community events. **You will be asked to leave.**

What do I do after I've pre-registered? How can I check my status or schedule an appointment?

Vaccine demand is extraordinarily high and supplies are significantly limited. Please do not call or email to check your status, and please be patient. Those who pre-register may not receive a return call or email for days or weeks, and may not get a vaccine appointment for weeks or months.

If you have already pre-registered through the Pittsylvania-Danville Health District's site, your information will be automatically transferred to the new centralized state registration site. If you experience difficulties with the search function in the "Check the List" search, check the spelling of your name and email address carefully and consider whether you may have used a different name, phone number or email address in the past.

How have people been selected for the events that have already happened in our community?

Registration for these events has been prioritized for people and communities at



highest risk of contracting COVID-19 and of experiencing more serious effects of illness.

As Virginia moves into additional priority phases, more opportunities will be available for more people.
